Exemption from the Requirement in Civil Aviation Rule

CAR61.39(a)

PURSUANT TO Section 37 of the Civil Aviation Act 1990,

I, John George Jones, Director of Civil Aviation, being satisfied that—

- (a) the action taken with respect to the requirement in Civil Aviation Rule 61.39(a) that each holder of a Commercial Pilot Licence (Balloon) must successfully complete a flight review within the immediately preceding 2 years prior to exercising the privileges of that licence, is as effective as actual compliance: and
- (b) the risk to safety will not be significantly increased by the granting of this exemption,

HEREBY EXEMPT—

each holder of a Commercial Pilot Licence (Balloon)

FROM—

the requirement in Civil Aviation Rule 61.39 (a) that each holder of a pilot licence issued under Part 61 shall not exercise the privileges of that licence unless the holder has, in accordance with 61.39(c), successfully completed a flight review within the immediately preceding 2 years conducted by an appropriately qualified flight instructor,

PROVIDED THAT—

the holder of the Commercial Pilot Licence (Balloon), prior to exercising the privileges of that licence, has successfully completed a flight review within the immediately preceding 2 years conducted by an Aviation Services Limited Designated Co-opted Flight Examiner (Balloon).

This exemption shall remain in effect unless withdrawn in writing by the Director.
